Dominica, officially the Commonwealth of Dominica, is an island country in the French Caribbean. It is part of the Windward Islands in the Lesser Antilles archipelago in the Caribbean Sea. The island is located between the two French overseas regions, Guadeloupe and Martinique. Dominica has been nicknamed the 'Nature Isle of the Caribbean' for its authentic, untouched natural environment. The island is also home to the world's second-largest hot spring, cascading waterfalls, and sugar-white and black volcanic sand beaches.





A variety of plants, animals and bird species call Dominica home, including iguanas, sea turtles, the endangered crapaud frog, 320 species of reef fish, the endemic Imperial parrot and sperm whales. In addition, more than 1,000 species of flowering plants can be found on the island, including 74 species of orchid and 200 ferns. Sixty percent of the island is covered in forest. The island is also home to the world's second-largest hot spring, cascading waterfalls, breathtaking beaches ranging from sugar-white to black volcanic sand and 365 rivers.

WHALE WATCHING


Some of nature's largest mammals make Dominica home. Dominica's sheer underwater drop-offs create deep sheltered bays along its western coastline—the perfect haven for the Sperm Whale to breed and calve. Dominica is the only country in the world where the sperm whale resides all year long, although sightings are most common between November and March. Boaters and fishermen report seeing the sperm whale at Scotts Head, Roseau, Layou, and Point Round. Whale watching operators follow strict codes of conduct, minimizing any disturbance, and never “luring” the whales. On the rare occasion when the whales may be elusive, you’re sure to see the acrobatics of hundreds of Spotted and Spinner Dolphins.



CHOCOLATE FACTORY EXPERIENCE

Experience a unique and memorable vacation in one of the most exceptional sites in Dominica. Located near Calibishie Village, Pointe Baptiste Estate is a private domain of 25 acres. There is a historical guesthouse from 1930, a chocolate factory with a cottage above.

The 1930's Villa is a beautiful home, lovingly built in the colonial style and rich in history with its antique furnishings, paintings, and library. From its vast veranda, you can admire the sea, the Red Rocks, and the islands of Marie Galante, the Saintes, and Guadeloupe.



KALINAGO COMMUNITY VISITS

Experience life as it was centuries ago. In the northeast corner of the island is the last remaining community of Carib Indians, the Kalinagos, Dominica's indigenous people.

Approximately 3,000 Kalinagos live in a collectively-owned 3,700 acre territory, spread over eight hamlets. Here, you can experience their traditional culture firsthand — dance and song, artistry, and daily living — can help you discover your ancient self — and how your most distant forebearers experienced the world. Here you can learn their ageless crafts of basket weaving, canoe building, pottery making, and wood carving, to name but a few.

HIKING TO RAINFORESTS, WATERFALLS & NATIONAL PARKS

Whether you're an amateur hiker or advanced, Dominica has many trails for both. The easier trails allow the casual hiker to get out and enjoy the Nature Island and its many outdoor wonders. For the most part, these trails are relatively wide and smooth with easy grades. Bridges are typically available when crossing water, streams or gullies.

For the serious hiker, Dominica is home to some of the most challenging and rewarding trails in the Caribbean and require hikers to be in very good physical condition. Sections of these trails can include grades that are often long and steep, and can exceed 35 percent.



DIVING & SNORKELING TOURS

A new frontier of fun. Dive into Dominica's offshore wonder world. Plunging cliff walls, vibrant colorful reefs, eerie caves and pass-throughs, boulder strewn sea beds, enchanting thermal vents sending crystal bubbles upward, and marine life of unparalleled beauty and diversity have made Dominica's coastal waters one of the world's premier diving and snorkeling destinations.

No matter what your skill level, its pristine waters will bathe you in wonder at every turn. And with dozens of dive and snorkeling sites to choose from, you'll find an underwater voyage that's certain to captivate your senses and breathe new life to your soul.

KAYAKING

Tranquil rivers and bays are perfect for kayaking. Dominica's pristine fresh waterways and the tranquil Caribbean Sea make kayaking an ideal way to explore Dominica.

The placid Soufrière Bay is a great route for beginners. The rich diversity of marine life and the serenity of the coves at the Soufrière/Scott's Head Marine Reserve will amaze and delight you. Experience the thrill of kayaking at high altitude on Freshwater Lake in the Morne Trois Pitons World Heritage Site. Dominica's longest river, the Layou, will take you past cooing birds, through light rapids, matted buttress roots, and diverse habitat.



HORSEBACK RIDING

To experience the Nature Island on horseback is truly a step back in time. Ride through pristine rainforest. Swim with your horse in the unspoiled Prince Rupert Bay. Encounter an endless array of wild and cultivated tropical flowers, ornamental plants and exotic fruit trees. Discover cultural and historical sites across the island from the best vantage point imaginable.

Dominica's mountain trails weave through one of the world's last remaining oceanic rain forests where nature truly comes alive. There's so much to see.



BIRDING

Dozens of beautiful birds call Dominica home. One of the first things you'll see in Dominica is a colorful Sisserou parrot right on the Dominica flag. This is the only place in the world where Sisserou and Jaco parrots are found. The Sisserou parrot is found specifically on the slopes of Morne Diablotin National Park which was established primarily to protect its prime habitat, and in the Morne Trois Pitons National Park. The Jaco Parrot, also known as the Red-Necked Amazon gets its common name from the red feathers found on its lower throat. Birding can be enjoyed throughout the year, however the peak in breeding for most species is between March and August.

TRAVEL INFORMATION

AIRPORT INFORMATION

Dominica is serviced by two airports: Douglas-Charles (DOM), formerly known as Melville Hall, and Canefield (DCF) Airports. Most visitors to Dominica will arrive through Douglas-Charles, the larger of the two airports.

- Distance from Douglas-Charles Airport (DOM) to Resort is 41 km, 45 min by car
- Distance from Canefield Airport (DCF) to Resort is 43 km, 40 min by car
- Distance from Roseau Seaport to Resort is 47 km, 50 min by car

AIRLINE CONNECTIVITY

From the United States, American Airlines provides a daily non-stop flight from Miami International Airport (MIA) to Douglas-Charles (DOM). Flights are also available via a one-stop connection through San Juan, Puerto Rico, on most days of the week or through other Caribbean hubs including Barbados (BGI) and St. Maarten (SXM).

International flights from Europe are connected to the island through hubs in Antigua (ANU), Barbados (BGI), Martinique (FDF), St. Maarten (SXM), Puerto Rico (SJU), Guadeloupe (PTP) and Trinidad (POS). Private Group Charter flights are also available.

CARIBBEAN CONNECTIVITY

Guests arriving from neighboring Caribbean islands may choose to travel by ferry from Guadeloupe or Martinique (two-hour travel time) or St. Lucia (four-hour travel time). Island travel is also available via Sunrise Airways with service to Antigua (ANU), St. Lucia (SLU), St. Kitts (SKB).



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
